What's Coming Up on in December:

Here are some things to look forward to on upcoming Sundays:

- November 30: Advent begins! We'll start off Advent with a bang, as we begin our look at the some of the Characters of Christmas. As we all know, it all starts with God the Father. So we'll look at how God set in motion the plan to send Jesus into our world way back at the beginning of the Old Testament. We'll also have lots of Advent devotionals and other resources available to help us all dive deeply into this God-filled time of year.
- December 7: Isaiah Prophesied the Messiah of Hope. We'll look at what the Old Testament prophets said about the Messiah, and the hope that Jesus brought then and now. We'll also celebrate all those with December birthdays.

- **December 27 The Nativity Story.** We'll used clips from the movie the Nativity Story and mix them in with carols and readings to experience the story of Jesus' birth in a different and profound way.

The Characters of Christmas

During Advent this year, we'll focus on some of the more important characters of Christmas. We start with God the Father (and sadly, I forgot to include God the Father as one of my Christmas characters until fairly recently.) Then we'll look at Isaiah and the prophetic announcements of the coming Messiah throughout the Old Testament. And during the last two Sundays of Advent, we'll take closer looks at both Mary and Jospeh, as we learn a bit more about that very first Christmas. Join us (and invite your friends and family) as we experience this season with some key figures in the Christmas story.

Essential Jesus Coming Up

We've learned about interpreting the bible. We know how important following Jesus is. And starting in January of 2026, it's time to take what we've learned and do some serious bible reading, as we focus on who Jesus is, what he did and said, and how we can become better disciples of Jesus. We'll read five biblical passages each week (a total of 10 Old Testament passages and 75 New Testament passages), with accompanying questions to help us all dig deeper into what we read. I hope you are looking forward to this as much as I am!

Fletcher Miller School Winter Wonderland

As many of you know, we purchased a bunch of toys for Clark's Toy Workshop for the kids at Fletcher Miller School last month. On December 13, the school will have a Winter Wonderland party where everyone is invited for a pancake breakfast, crafts and fun, and the kids who use adaptative toys will be able to select their Christmas gifts. Some of us will be helping at the party, but there are still opportunities on December 12 from 3 to 7 to help set up for the party. (You'll be working with the staff to decorate the space and organizing everything for the big day.) Poinsettia Orders

Advent Devotionals Now Available

This year, we have some Advent devotionals available to help you really live into this season. Our Advent devotionals include:

- In the Manger, by Max Lucado. This devotional includes 25 inspirational selections each of which include a Bible verse to deeply reflect on, an inspirational passage from some of Max's most popular books, and a prayer to help you apply the day's message.
- Awaiting the Manger: Whispers of Advent in the Old Testament, by Ocieanna Fleiss. For those interested in the Old Testament passages tied to the coming of Jesus, this book provides 25 devotions, each of which include the story of an Old Testament character, a scripture passage, prayer, reflection questions and a hymn.
- Shadow & Light: A Journey into Advent, by Tsh
 Oxenreider. A book that teaches about the basics of
 Advent and then includes one reading for each day of
 the four weeks of Advent. Each day's reading includes
 Scripture, a reflection, a question, and a simple
 activity to engage the senses, such as lighting
 candles, listening to music, and viewing artwork both
 old and new.
- Come and See: exploring the Names of Jesus as a family through Advent, by Beth Meverden and Jenna Hallock. This big box is for families wanting to help kids celebrate Advent. The guide includes Scripture, discussion, and hands-on learning activities to keep Christ at the center of your family's Christmas celebrations.

The Advent devotionals are on a table in the Narthex. We encourage every person to take one - they are wonderful ways to help celebrate the coming of Christmas each day. But please take only one per person, so we have enough for everyone.

Advent Calendars

Family Advent calendars from ELCA World Hunger are available on the Welcome Table. Through bible passages, songs and suggested actions, they contain daily reminders of how we can follow Jesus and change the world.
