Our Call To Love

On Sunday, February 1, following my sermon on Jesus' teachings on the Sermon on the Mount, I (Dana) expressed my concerns about what's going on in Minneapolis and other cities in our country. For those who weren't able to hear my comments, following is a close approximation of what I said:

"I can't walk us through Jesus' teachings in this sermon - his call to love our enemies, his reminder that God blesses those in the margins, his command to treat people as we want to be treated -- without speaking to what's going on in Minneapolis and other cities across the US. I'm hoping if I share where I am, it may help some of you process your own thoughts.

When I saw the videos of heavily armed ICE agents violently and seemingly indiscriminately arresting people based on how they looked or spoke, or their country of origin, and also saw the videos of Renee Good and Alex Pretti killed by ICE agents, I was shocked, and angry, and dismayed and scared, and just really really sad. Because this is all just so wrong.

As disciples of Jesus, we see and interpret everything through the lens of our faith; it informs everything we think and do. And we know this, we talk about it again and again here at Glory of God -- everyone is made in God's image, everyone is God's beloved child, and every single person deserves to be treated with dignity and respect. And this is true for all people, regardless of one's immigration status, regardless of one's political views, regardless of any other characteristic that someone wants to apply to divide or demean.

And while I am sometimes at a loss as to what to do here, I do know that I need to do something. I do know that I cannot avoid looking, or somehow pretend that this has nothing to do with me. This is my government acting and if I don't speak up, I am complicit.

Our Call To Love (Con't)

I still have a lot of uncertainty about how to move forward -- it will take lots of prayer, lots of discernment. But you know over these last few days and weeks I've seen and heard about some really brave and compassionate people in Minneapolis and elsewhere acting in love to help their neighbors, and that gives me hope. Because this we know -- love is more powerful than hate or fear or anger or anything else the world can throw at us. Love is who our God is and, therefore, it's who we are as well."

I am sharing this message with all humility, recognizing that disciples of Jesus can see things differently. If anyone wants to talk further, I'd love to. Please contact me.

What's Coming Up on Sundays in February:

Here are some things to look forward to on upcoming Sundays:

- **The Sermon on the Mount on February 1.** We'll look at what Jesus has to say about how we live as his disciples in the world in this famous compilation of Jesus' teachings. We'll also celebrate those with February birthdays, and bless some blankets made by the craft group.
- **Some Challenging Teachings of Jesus on February 8.** We look at five hard sayings of Jesus about wealth, forgiveness, and the cost of discipleship. We'll see that some of Jesus' words were so challenging that many of his followers left him. And stay after worship to celebrate Nancy Harju's 90th birthday.

- **February 15 - Some Parables of Jesus.** Today, we concentrate on some of Jesus' parables in Luke's gospel, including the parables of lost things, the story of the Good Samaritan, the rich man who built bigger barns, and more. What do these parables teach us about God and God's kingdom?

- **More Parables of Jesus on February 22.** On this first Sunday in Lent, we look at lots of parables in Matthew's gospel that give us clues as to what God's kingdom looks like. These are some of my favorites -- the wheat and weeds, the workers in the vineyard and Jesus' famous parable of the sheep and goats.

February 8 Super Bowl Sock Collection

As part of our sock collection for our homeless care bags, we also have the opportunity to show our support for the two teams playing on the Super Bowl. On Sunday, February 8, bring in athletic and other warm socks to "vote" for the team you want to win. We have two boxes in the Narthex -- one for the New England Patriots and the other for the Seattle Seahawks. One pair of socks = one vote. And we encourage everyone to bring in lots of socks and vote multiple times. We'll announce our "winner" during worship (and then you can see how accurate we were when you watch the Super Bowl later that day). All socks collected will go in our care bags or to local agencies who work with the homeless.

Collection of personal items and socks

We're continuing our collection of personal care items to make more care bags for the homeless. The craft group is busy knitting hats and the rest of us can help by bringing in toiletries, small snack items and warm socks to fill our bags. Needed items include hand wipes, toothbrushes and travel size toothpaste, small deodorant, lip balm, feminine products, and non-perishable food items like small packages of crackers and cheese, granola bars, tuna/peanut butter packs, and beef jerky. Please put your items in the bin in the entryway. (And check out the article about our special Super Bowl sock collection.)

We will also be on zoom for those who cannot make it in person.

February 18 Ash Wednesday Worship

This is a wonderful opportunity to start Lent off on the right foot, by reminding ourselves who we are and whose we are.
