Here's some stuff to look forward to on Sundays in October:

- **Bible Basics 2 on Sunday, October 5:** we'll continue our look at bible basics with a focus on some Lutheran insights that help us interpret the Bible. We'll also celebrate all those with October birthdays.

#### **Fletcher Miller School**

As many of you know, GOG is beginning a partnership with Fletcher Miller School this year. Fletcher Miller School is less than 5 miles away in Kipling and is the only public school in Colorado that deals solely with students with significant support needs.

In September, a couple of us from GOG went on a tour of the school and we'll be sharing some of our observations over the next months. However, what we all came away with were the powerful stories of kids and staff and the amazing things being done at Fletcher to literally change the lives of these kids and their families. We are truly blessed as a congregation to have the privilege of playing even a small part in what's happening there.

We are already helping by participating in Clark's Toy Workshop, an opportunity to buy specific toys that will then be modified to add a switch access so that they can be played with by kids with complex special needs. (We saw some of these toys on our tour, and the creativity just blew me away.) We'll be doing a noisy offering on Sunday, October 12 to help buy some toys.

On Friday, October 24, we'll also be providing the staff at Fletcher Miller with some drinks and snacks during an in-service workday. More information as to the specific items we'll need will be coming soon, but please consider being a part of this partnership however you can.

If anyone who wants to help immediately you can check out the <u>Christmas in July program</u> to purchase toys which will be adapted for kids through Clark's Toy Workshop.

## Glory of God's Columbarium

As most of you know, Glory of God has a really nice columbarium in the back of our building. Not only is it a beautiful space for outdoor worship in the summer, but it's also a place that holds the cremated remains of many of our beloved church folks. Over the last few years (probably due in large part to the pandemic), the operation of the columbarium has been handled primarily by GOG office staff, and we're now looking for people who would like to serve on the Columbarium Committee to assist in its future operation. I (Pastor Dana) have signed up Glory of God to participate in Wheat Ridge's Trunk or Treat event on Saturday, October 25, from 4 - 6 p.m. at The Green at 7101 W. 38th Street. (Trunk or Treat events are really common in the Midwest where I come from, but for anyone who doesn't know what they are, it's where a group of cars gather in a parking lot and decorate their trunks with creative disguises, and children go from car to car for treats.) So my car will be out there representing Glory of God, and I'd love a couple other people to join me, either by bringing their own cars or helping me decorate mine. We can come in costumes (or not). I'm not the best car decorator, so I could use some help. (They even have prizes for best car, although I'm not shooting to win.) Each car also has to bring at least 2000 treats (which means there will be a lot of kids and families present). This is another great opportunity to be involved in the community, get our name out there, and help make a whole bunch of kids and families happy.

#### **Collection for the Homeless**

During October, we will again be helping out the Wheat Ridge Homeless Navigation Program by collecting hats, socks, gloves, and hand warmers. (We're focusing on the hand warmers, but feel free to bring in any of the needed items.) It gets cold in Colorado in the winter, and we can help a lot of people by providing these needed items. (There will be a collection box near the door to the worship space.)


